From the Desk of Sister Mary

Dear Parents, Students, and Friends,

We are presently celebrating the Easter Season, the central season of our Church Year. We have just experienced the "Life, Death, Resurrection" cycle of Jesus' life. What we need to be open to learning and understanding is that if we are going to proclaim "Jesus as Lord," if we are going to say we are Christian or Catholic, then we too must experience the Life, Death, Resurrection of Jesus daily, and sometimes hourly. Most of us would gladly choose the Resurrection; it is the Life and Death that is the struggle.

As we celebrate the Eucharist each week we are led into understanding is that each of us enters into this Paschal Mystery of Life, Death, and Resurrection. Our active participation in the mass transforms each of us. This transformation helps us understand and compels us to proclaim "Jesus is Lord." It compels us to do Justice. If we truly participate in the mass, we have no alternative - we are compelled to act justly!

This leads me to my next point which will not be popular no, in many cases, welcome. Many of our families receive tuition reduction because you are active in your parish. I am happy for you, and ideologically I believe you should get this benefit. A number of you are not aware that our school receives almost nothing from any revenue source to offset this benefit. I am not writing to address this concern, although it is a concern.

I am writing to address a larger and more serious concern. The lack of, and absence of, participation in the liturgy each week, either as a family or individually is not an expression of a love relationship with our God. The attitude seems to be "I will take the \$2,000 deduction in tuition, but I have no intention of being in attendance at weekly mass." Weekly participation at mass is one of precepts of the Church. This has not changed. In the class I teach, I asked this morning, as I usually do, how many went to mass Sunday/Saturday. Only (I say only with much sadness) five students out of 19 had found time for mass on the weekend. This is a lack of responsibility on the family's part. I do not understand this.

The mass is our deepest commitment to prayer. It is our central focusing event. No wonder families are torn apart, siblings can easily be mean and even kill one another, and much injustice prevails. We must experience the Eucharistic presence of our God. In comparison to many other countries of the world, it is so available to us. We need to get our priorities in line/order and carry them out.

Students will not be permitted to take semester examinations, receive report cards, or register for the following semester until all financial obligations have been met. (Section No. 5.01 (G), 2.10 (B), & 4.20(A) of the Diocesan School Policy)

Bourgade Catholic High School Policy Regarding Financial Obligations:

School families who have missed two monthly payments and have not made suitable arrangements with the Director of Finance within 10 days of the second missed payment will be informed that their child/children will not be allowed to attend school.

Student accounts that are two months late and have not made suitable arrangements with the Director of Finance within 10 days of the second missed payment will not be allowed to participate in any school sponsored or related activity.

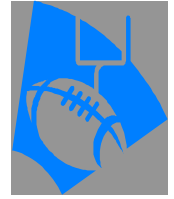
